Background

Connecticut is expected to receive over \$600 million over 18 years as part of the nationwide opioid litigation settlement agreements with various pharmaceutical distributors and opioid manufacturers. The Town of Ellington established the Opioid Awareness Committee to ensure the proceeds received by the state are allocated appropriately. The proceeds will be spent on substance use disorder abatement infrastructure, programs, services, supports, and resources for prevention, treatment, recovery, and harm reduction with public involvement, transparency, and accountability.

Goals

The goals of the Ellington Opioid Awareness Committee is to spread awareness of this epidemic as an essential step in prevention. We also want to provide resources and access to treatment for those in recovery. The Ellington Opioid Committee believes that there is HOPE, HELP is available, and the ability to HEAL for all affected by substance misuse.

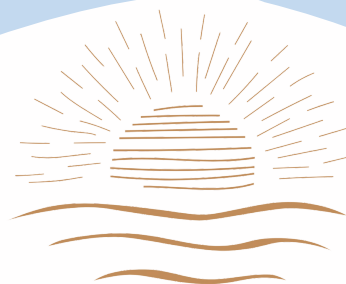
